To assist individuals with disabilities achieve meaningful lives, rich with relationships, while living and working in their own communities





To accomplish this we sought to create a program that...

- Is based on the five principles of self-determination:
 - Freedom
 - Support
 - Confirmation
 - Responsibility
 - Authority



- Utilizes non-traditional services and supports
- Builds on the existing quality management system
- Allows comprehensive comparison studies of traditional Medicaid and self-directed programs



Background

- General assembly passed HB
 116 in 2004
- Original CDO created for current 1915 waivers
 - Supports for Community Living
 - Home and Community Based
 - Acquired Brain Injuries
- Targeted at individuals with MR/DD, brain injuries and the frail and elderly





Background

- Participation based on consumer choice
- Non-traditional/non-medical services
- Not an increase or expansion of services
- Expected to serve 250 in year one and 2,000 by year five





- KyHealth Choices 1115 Waiver
- Integrate 1915 waivers
- CDO for long term care plans
- Self-Determination Pilot
 - 150 participants
 - ABI, MR/DD, Frail and Elderly
 - Self-Determination and Waiver Integration Teams

 - Knowledge of what should be reported

- Develop clear parameters
 - Health and safety
